A Summer Rubik's Cube

This summer the American Library will be rectifying a longstanding peculiarity in the way its book collections are physically arranged. For years, even decades, the Library's biography, mystery, art, and fiction collections each have been divided – partly on the mezzanine and partly on the ground floor, under no useful organizing principle.

Executing this dramatic shift of tens of thousands of books -- a librarian's Rubik's cube -- will require the **use of a portion of the reading room as a work space** during the summer months. Books temporarily unavailable in open stacks can be retrieved by staff and volunteers. We apologize for the temporary inconvenience, and wish you a safe and pleasant summer. 
